



The Fall: A Father's Memoir in 424 Steps, by Diogo Mainardi, Margaret Jull Costa (Trans.) (Other Press, \$20) "In this memoir, Mainardi, the great Brazilian journalist/novelist, traces the life and sufferings of his son, Tito. Due to the gross negligence of the hospital in which Tito was born, he has been afflicted with cerebral palsy. Tito's story is told in 424 parts—two or three per page—by turns angry, loving, and poetic, that mirror the greatest number of steps Tito has ever taken without falling down.
