**Fever Dream: A Novel, by Samanta Schweblin, Megan McDowell (Trans.) (Riverhead Books, \$16)**

"Haunting, foreboding, eerie, and ominous, Schweblin's *Fever Dream* is the first of the Argentine author's books to appear in English. Despite its brevity, *Fever Dream* throbs with a quickened pulse, as heightening tension is its most effective quality. An intriguing yet purposefully vague plot adds to the story's mystique, one of peril, poison, and the unexplained terror of worms. Metaphorical in scope, Schweblin's impressively constructed tale leaves much to the imagination but is all the richer for doing so.
