




Wingshooters: A Novel, by Nina Revoyr (Akashic Books, \$15.95) "An abandoned young girl narrates this tale set in 1974 in a small Wisconsin town as it plummets and tumbles into heartbreak. You don't belong here,' the townspeople tell the mixed-race schoolgirl and anyone else who is not like them. Revoyr's voice vibrates with the spiritual and physical isolation—without adornment or illusion—that is reminiscent of the writings of Carson McCullers. The pacing is perfect, and Wingshooters captures fully the tragedy of personal rejection resulting from racial tension, as it explores both connection and loss and the enduring bonds of family. –James Harris, Prairie Lights Books, Iowa City, IA
