**The Friendship Doll, by Kirby Larson (Delacorte, \$15.99)** "In 1927, Japan sent 58 Japanese dolls as ambassadors of goodwill to America. This story is told from the point of view of one of those dolls, Miss Kawanaga. Miss Kawanaga finds that having a heart is a very important thing, and Larson challenges readers to see the impact of this historic gift through the eyes of the various girls who come into contact with this exquisite doll. Today, 45 dolls are accounted for and through Miss Kawanaga, Larson issues the challenge to locate the 13 dolls that are missing." —Margaret Brennan Neville, *The King's English*, Salt Lake City, UT
