**Northwest Angle: A Novel, by William Kent Krueger (Atria, \$24.99)** "Krueger's latest Cork O'Connor tale is partly based on a real event—straight-line winds that flattened a great swath of forest in northern Minnesota. This fast-paced thriller leads the reader through a tangled web of secrets that unfolds unpredictably until the satisfying end. The characters are deep and spiritual and the landscape beautiful.
