A Lily of the Field: A Novel, by John Lawton (Grove Press, \$14.95) "Lawton's latest thriller begins in 1934 Vienna when Meret Voytek, a child prodigy, becomes the pupil of the world-class concert cellist Viktor Rosen. Even as Rosen flees to London in advance of the Nazis, Karel Szabo, a Hungarian physicist, is interned in a camp on the Isle of Man, where his path crosses not just Rosen's but also that of the brother to then-Sargent Troy, the man at the center of all Lawton's books. The mystery at the heart of this tale centers on the two musicians, both uprooted and adrift in a world changed utterly by war and by science." —Betsy Burton, *The King's English Bookshop, Salt Lake City, UT*
