**If Jack's in Love: A Novel, by Stephen Wetta (Amy Einhorn Books/Putnam, \$24.95)** "Jack Witcher is 12 going on 13 and in love with Myra Joyner. When Myra's brother goes missing and Jack's older brother, Stan, becomes the leading suspect in the disappearance, Jack's world starts to unravel. Not that he ever had it very good: his father is unemployed and hangs around the house watching soap operas; his brother is a pot-smoking 'hippie freak' with a terrible temper; and his mother is trying to understand why her family is the laughingstock of the town. 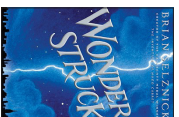
**Mary Ann in Autumn: A Tales of the City Novel, by Armistead Maupin (Harper Perennial, \$14.99)**

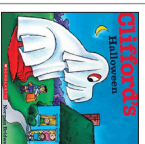
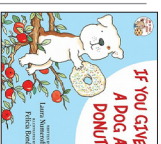

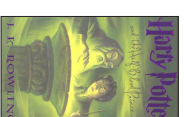
