Ed King: A Novel, by David Guterson (Knopf, \$26.95) "A rollicking modern-day version of the classic tragedy *Oedipus Rex*, this wickedly funny story will leave you in stitches. It has the cynicism of Tom Wolfe mixed with the absurdity of Carl Hiaasen. The novel begins with a slow and dangerous seduction, and then picks up speed as each new character is introduced. Midnight Rising: John Brown and the Raid That Sparked the Civil War, by Tony Horwitz (Henry Holt & Co., \$28) "The Civil War had its origins long before Fort Sumter, but possibly the biggest spark was provided by one extremely intense, driven man, John Brown. Brown's raid on Harpers Ferry in 1859 not only provided a frightening specter to nervous Southern slave owners, it was also a moral slap in the face to the rest of the country, especially during his trial.
