Agent 6, by Tom Rob Smith (Grand Central Publishing, \$25.99) "The conclusion of the Child 44 trilogy is as fast-paced and exciting as the first two volumes. A Charitable Body, by Robert Barnard (Scribner, \$24) "Inspector Charlie Peace, Barnard's Yorkshire detective, plays a part in this mystery, but it is his wife, Felicity, who takes center stage. As a local novelist and scholar, Felicity is invited to join the board of Walbrook Manor, a stately home recently gifted to the nation. While Felicity digs into the manor's past, someone else digs up a body and Charlie begins digging into the mysterious death. Barnard's mysteries reflect England's golden age of Agatha Christie whodunits, but his characters are modern, well-rounded, and sympathetic.
