Explorer: The Mystery Boxes, by Kazu Kibuishi (Amulet, \$10.95) "Explorer" features a compilation of seven stories in graphic form, each by a different author/illustrator, yet each featuring a mysterious—and often magical—box that serves to tie the stories together. From Johane Matte and Symone Panelkham's box in an alien universe-building warehouse to Dave Roman and Raina Telmeier's magical box found in the back of an ordinary closet, *Explorer* holds something for readers of every genre.
