The Expeditioners, by S.S. Taylor (McSweeney's, \$22) "Make way for the Wests—Zander, Kit, and MK—three orphans living in the near future, where computers and electricity have failed. They are determined to discover what happened to their father, the famous cartographer Alexander West, on his last expedition but must lay low so that evil government officials don't learn that they no longer have adult supervision. The plot thickens when a mysterious stranger finds Kit in a market and hands him half a map, which the kids immediately recognize as one of their father's.
