The Fairy Bell Sisters #1: Sylva and the Fairy Ball, by Margaret McNamara, Julia Denos (illus.) (Balzer + Bray, \$4.99) "This is a fun new series for early chapter book readers. In Book #1, Sylva wants to go to the fairy ball, but she isn't old enough. When she tries to help her older sisters with their ball gowns, all her plans go awry, but in a delightful twist she manages to arrive for one month each year and wreak havoc on the island, forcing the fairies to go into hiding. It isn't until Rosy breaks that rule that children and fairies meet. Denos' charming illustrations bring the fairies' world to life."
