Brewster: A Novel, by Mark Slouka (W.W. Norton, \$25.95) "The setting is Brewster, New York, in 1968, at the peak of the Vietnam War. Sixteen-year-old Jon Mosher, the son of Jewish immigrants who escaped Europe during WWII, is searching for his own escape from a dead-end town and his guilt over his older brother's death. He meets fellow student Ray Cappiccano and together they struggle to make sense of their quickly changing world. Jon discovers his strength in running track with his high school team, and Ray finds a similar outlet as a fighter. 

Countdown City: The Last Policeman, Book II, by Ben H. Winters (Quirk Books, \$14.95)
