**The Bird Skinner: A Novel, by Alice Greenway (Atlantic Monthly Press, \$24)** "Following the amputation of one of his legs, ornithologist Jim Carroway withdraws from the world and settles on an island off the coast of Maine. His alcohol- and cigarette-filled solitude is interrupted when the daughter of a friend he hasn't seen in 30 years arrives unannounced from the Solomon Islands.
