The Bohemians: Mark Twain and the San Francisco Writers Who Reinvented American Literature, by Ben Tarnoff (Penguin Press, \$27.95) "Four writers who changed the face of American literature—Mark Twain, Bret Harte, Charles Warren Stoddard, and Ina Coolbrith—arrived in San Francisco in the 1860s and immediately found the city's 'intoxicating energy' to be just the elixir they needed to create a new American literature free from the 'heavy European influence that dominated the East.'
