All That Followed: A Novel, by Gabriel Urza (Henry Holt, \$25) "All That Followed sheds some much-needed light on a region with an incredibly rich cultural history and a painful, tormented political past.The story is told in short chapters from three different perspectives: Joni, an American who fell in love with a Basque woman and has lived in Muriga, a small Basque town, since the 1940s; Mariana, a young woman from Muriga whose husband belonged to the wrong political party and was kidnapped and murdered; and Iker, the young man who is in jail for that crime.
