Multiply/Divide: On the American Real and Surreal, by Wendy S. Walters (Sarabande Books, \$15.95) "In *Multiply/Divide*, Walters sifts through the weird, quietly horrifying wreckage that structural racism has left behind in everyday American life and presents something like a mythology, but stranger; because it is real, and we have never known life without it. Her prose is as clear as day, her stories are candid, and only a poet could have written a book of essays like this.
