Jade Dragon Mountain: A Novel, by Elsa Hart
(Minotaur, \$25.99) "Hart has written an excellent historical whodunit set in a remote province of Imperial China in I708. Li Du, a librarian in exile, investigates the murder of an old Jesuit priest a few days before the arrival of the emperor. Full of mythological, cultural, and historical details, Jade Dragon Mountain also offers a fascinating analysis of the period when foreign businessmen began coveting China's riches, in particular its tea.
