The Hired Girl, by Laura Amy Schlitz (Candlewick Press, \$17.99) "I'd expect nothing less from Schlitz, but was happy nonetheless to find her latest book a captivating and delightful story. Based on the journal of Joan Skraggs, Schlitz's grandmother, *The Hired Girl* is the comical and sweet tale of a 14-year-old girl who leaves her harsh life on the farm to find work in the big city—Baltimore in 1911. Joan confides all in her diary as she grows up, with some bumps along the way.
