



Her late marriage to Clemens' business manager left her life in shambles, as afterwards both were fired and slandered. What led to those dramatic shifts is the premise behind Twain's End. Mark Twain may be beloved beyond all American writers, but Cullen has crafted a wellresearched tale supporting the view that a very manipulative, selfish, and distant Samuel Clemens and his family hid behind that façade. 




