**Only Love Can Break Your Heart: A Novel, by Ed Tarkington (Algonquin Books, \$25.95)**

"Tarkington's debut novel feels positively Shakespearean in its sense of family dynamics and the sometimes destructive power of love, but it speaks with the deceptively plain, poignant language of a Neil Young song.
