The Madwoman Upstairs: A Novel, by Catherine Lowell (Touchstone, \$25.99) “*The Madwoman Upstairs* is both a reference to the insane wife of Edward Rochester in *Jane Eyre* and to Samantha Whipple, who is the last remaining descendant of the Brontë sisters. This exciting literary debut is in part a study of literature, specifically the works of the Brontë sisters, and in part an exploration of the mystery of their legacy. Samantha cannot escape her past, the world's interest in her inheritance of previously undiscovered family treasures, and the current puzzle of artifacts mysteriously appearing in her room that may or may not answer some of her questions.
