The Ear, the Eye and the Arm, by Nancy Farmer (Scholastic, \$7.99, originally published in 2004) "The Ear, the Eye, and the Arm are detectives in the year 2194 whose exposure to nuclear waste gives them unique and special powers. They have been called in to find three children who escaped from a powerful Zimbabwe family and then disappeared. Farmer mixes ancient African mythology with dystopian elements to create a science fiction/fantasy adventure full of weight.
