**The Past: A Novel, by Tessa Hadley (Harper Perennial, \$15.99)** "A novel about a family vacation is often used as a device to bring out the worst flaws of the characters; here it is used to bring out the best of Hadley's writing talent. She brings the family together, introducing them one by one: Harriet, the outdoorsy one; Alice, the dramatic one; Fran, the motherly one; Roland, the scholarly brother. The siblings, along with assorted children, spouses, and a young friend, spend three weeks in the crumbling house that belonged to their grandparents, trying to decide what must be done with it.
