You Will Not Have My Hate, by Antoine Leiris (Penguin Press, \$23) "This slender tome began as a social media sensation. Shortly after the terrorist attacks in Paris in November 2015, Leiris, a husband and father, wrote an open letter to the perpetrators of those attacks, stating time and again that they would not have his hate, despite the fact that he lost his wife and the mother of their infant son. This memoir closely follows the hours after the attack, chronicling Leiris' thoughts and emotions for the next several days, up through the funeral for his wife.
