Kids of Appetite, by David Arnold (Viking Books for Young Readers, \$18.99) "Sixteen-year-old Vic suffers from Moebius syndrome, a rare neurological disorder that causes facial paralysis. Bullied by his classmates and often assumed to be stupid by adults, Vic is actually witty and intelligent, a lover of art and opera. What Vic's face cannot show is that he still grieves for his father, who died two years ago. When Vic runs away on a quest to scatter his father's ashes, he bumps into a ragtag group of homeless kids called the Kids of Appetite who take him in and treat him with kindness.
