Within five pages, we are given the thrilling start to an exemplary narrative that ends with an unbelievable twist. Alosa is portrayed as both a kickass heroine and a maturing young woman who is thrust into a maritime feud between her father, lord apparent over the pirate world, and two orphaned brothers attempting to make their own mark.
