Daughter of the Pirate King, by Tricia Levenseller (Feiwel & Friends, \$17.99) "In *Daughter of the Pirate King*, Levenseller introduces readers to the dangerously cunning Alosa through a fight scene in the first chapter. Within five pages, we are given the thrilling start to an exemplary narrative that ends with an unbelievable twist. Alosa is portrayed as both a kickass heroine and a maturing young woman who is thrust into a maritime feud between her father, lord apparent over the pirate world, and two orphaned brothers attempting to make their own mark.
