

# **Another Indie Favorite**

Heat and Light: A Novel, by Jennifer Haigh (Ecco, \$14.99) "Haigh has been building a body of work around Bakerton, Pennsylvania, for more than a decade. In this new novel, Haigh once again unleashes the sweep of historical forces as out-of-state companies look to drill for natural gas deposits. There is hope among residents that the future will be brighter, but there is also the risk that they will just end up victims of greed and further environmental ruin. This is a bigissue oriented book, but its success is found in the brilliance with which Haigh crafts her characters and makes their lives a vehicle for looking at the moral, political, environmental, and economic questions about fracking.
