**The Outrun, by Amy Liptrot (W.W. Norton, \$25.95)** "After escaping to London from her isolated Orkney Island home, Liptrot self-medicates through her 20s until she has lost her lover and most of her friends and belongings. Stumbling to understand her alcoholic choices and looking for change, she returns to the isles. In *The Outrun*, Liptrot writes of her mostly solitary life, using technology to stay in touch and to explore the isles. Her minute-by-minute struggle to stay sober counterbalances the ebb and flow of the ocean and winds and the passing seasons. This debut is striking and compelling. I was enthralled by Liptrot's descriptions of the islands, their history, geology, and living beings.
