#### The Leavers, by Lisa Ko (Algonquin, \$25.95)

"Deming Guo is a 12-year-old, Chinese-American Bronx native. When his mother abandons him without warning, he thinks he will be able to make a life with his mother's friend and her son. But when that friend gives him up to foster care and he is shipped off to live with white university professors in upstate New York, his life is turned on end once again.
