**Blackout: A Novel, by Marc Elsberg (Sourcebooks Landmark, \$26.99)** “In *Blackout*, hackers are able to take down all the electrical grids across Europe, resulting in a total blackout more far-reaching than anything previously thought possible. Once it becomes clear that this event is not a glitch and the depths of the crisis—no lights, no heat, no Internet, no cell service—become evident, chaos ensues. Piero Manzano is an activist and a former hacker whose investigation into the cause of the disaster soon makes him a prime suspect and forces him to run from the authorities. This is a taut, fast-paced thriller about a frighteningly plausible scenario.”

While the victims of the serial killer greatly affect Wade, who gives his all to catch him, it is the apparent suicide of a young teenager that really shakes up his world. Much more than just a search for a killer, *Shadow Man* is about living in the shadows of what happened in the past. *Shadow Man* could be called a thriller, but it is really much more than that, with characters that are so real you can feel their pain.”
