See What I Have Done, by Sarah Schmidt (Atlantic Monthly Press, \$26) “*See What I Have Done* is a spellbinding historic reimagining of a Gothic tale many of us grew up knowing about. Schmidt brings to life all the characters in Lizzie Borden’s world and takes the reader on an adventure through time and the investigation into the murder of her parents.
