Young Jane Young: A Novel, by Gabrielle Zevin (Algonquin Books, \$26.95) "I've been waiting for a quirky, funny, thoughtful novel to follow in the footsteps of *Where'd You Go, Bernadette*, and behold: I have found it. The Child Finder: A Novel, by Rene Denfeld (Harper, \$25.99) "In Rene Denfeld's new novel, a woman who searches for abducted or lost children must confront her own memories of being abducted as a young girl. While searching for a girl recently kidnapped in her hometown, she is haunted by her past and the lies that she used to weave her present, lies that often took the form of stories. Meanwhile, the abducted girl must survive years of terror and heartbreak, all while constructing a magical mythology to shield herself from the atrocities of her captor. These characters, especially the women, are strong and imaginative.
