**The Exact Nature of Our Wrongs: A Novel, by Janet Peery (St. Martin's Press, \$26.99)** "Long-suffering Hattie Campbell and her irascible husband, Abel, are in their 80s and still manipulating, enabling, and worrying about their four adult children, all of whom suffer, to some degree or other, from addiction, jealousy, and neediness. Billy, the youngest of the siblings, is both the most likable and most damaged. As Abel's health declines and Billy deteriorates, the remaining siblings compete to win their parents' favor. Peery's long-awaited follow-up to her National Book Award-finalist *The River Beyond the World* is a sympathetic portrait of a dysfunctional, complex, and funny clan who, although they try, can't slip the family ties that bind." —Cindy Pauldine, the river's end bookstore, Oswego, NY
