Invitation to a Bonfire: A Novel, by Adrienne Celt (Bloomsbury Publishing, \$26) “Adrienne Celt’s *Invitation to a Bonfire* is a propulsive literary thriller masterfully constructed and written with an extraordinary, raw urgency that will leave readers breathless.
