The Book of Essie: A Novel, by Meghan MacLean Weir (Knopf, \$25.95) "The Book of Essie is a captivating debut. The novel focuses on 16-year-old Essie Hicks, a star on a reality TV show following her preacher father and her ultra-religious, conservative family. When Essie finds out she is pregnant, she must protect herself and her future in the face of public scorn. I couldn't stop turning the pages to see what would happen to Essie and Roarke, the boy Essie's mother has decided she will marry in a primetime, live-televized wedding.
