**Dear Mrs. Bird: A Novel, by AJ Pearce (Scribner, \$26)** "What initially seems like a breezy career girl story quickly turns into a gripping novel set in the WWII London blitzkrieg. During the nightly bombing runs, Emmeline volunteers at a nearby fire dispatch center. She dreams of becoming a journalist, but instead lands a day job screening advice-seeking letters for a weekly magazine, *Women's Friends*. All too soon, she and her friends become victims of the bombings and must deal with losses and new horrors each night. In *Dear Mrs. Bird*, AJ Pearce has given us a most memorable story about both the visible and hidden casualties of war. **America for Beginners: A Novel, by Leah Franqui (William Morrow, \$26.99)** "A poignant story that confronts cultural, racial, and gender stereotypes through three people who end up on a trip across the U.S. The story revolves around a Bengali widow of means whose gay son was disowned; a young Bangladeshi man who has a job as a tour agent; and a young, white American woman who aspires to be an actress. These three are united in the journey initiated by the widow to tour the U.S., but really to find her son and confront his lover.
