Loudermilk: Or, the Real Poet; Or, the Origin of the World, by Lucy Ives (Soft Skull Press, \$16.95) "Lucy Ives has created something special in *Loudermilk*. The early 2000s setting is unmistakable, and while all the characters are both familiar (in all the right ways) and written with at least some degree of love, none are spared by Ives' razor-sharp satire.
