**The Bell in the Lake: A Novel, by Lars Mytting, Deborah Dawkin (Transl.) (The Overlook Press, \$27)** "Perfect for fans of Kieran Millwood Hargrave's *The Mercies*, this Norwegian bestseller is an atmosphere-lover's dream. Set in the secluded village of Butangen in 1880, *The Bell in the Lake* chronicles its residents' lives, all centered around a 700-year-old church and its mystical bells. Mytting effortlessly captures the push and pull between history and modernity, stringing his story with tension and moments of rare beauty. **Down Along With That Devil's Bones: A Reckoning With Monuments, Memory, and the Legacy of White Supremacy, by Connor Towne O'Neill (Algonquin Books, \$26.95)** "The past won't go anywhere—especially the racist past endorsed by the contemporary enablers of the Nathan Bedford Forrest mythology.
