BANNED BOOKS BINGO INSTRUCTIONS

Banned Books Bingo is designed to be an interactive way for booksellers to engage with customers about banned books.

BINGO Game Option 1:

We've provided a blank BINGO card for you to fill out digitally, or fill in titles by hand before the game. You can use <u>ALA's most challenged books list</u> with additional links to previous year's lists.

BINGO Game Option 2:

Print the blank BINGO cards for each player and have them write in titles themselves from a printed list provided to them, including the banned books title and author's name.

Playing BINGO:

The blank BINGO cards each have a free space with the Let Freedom Read graphic.

Print a copy of the "calling" page to fill out and cut into squares, then place into a bowl or basket to pull from.

Designate a caller who picks the paper and announces the banned book title to the players.

Provide the players with a pen, highlighter, bingo dauber, or chips to mark their cards with.

When a player(s) gets a full line (vertical, horizontal, or diagonal) and shouts "BINGO!" the game is concluded. Feel free to choose other winning BINGO patterns such as 4 corners, Postage Stamp, full card — it's up to you to decide the rules!
